

S. Gloucestershire CCG **Acceptance** Criteria

Conditions/symptoms included in the service

- Differential diagnosis of red eye
- Dry eye / epiphora
- Pigmented chorioretinal lesions
- Maculopathy and retinal disease
- Suspected chronic open angle glaucoma and OHT
- Vitreoretinal symptoms requiring exclusion of retinal detachment

S. Gloucestershire CCG **Exclusion** Criteria

Conditions excluded from the service that will need Acute Hospital intervention:

- Patients aged under 18
- Conditions requiring surgical intervention
- Binocular Vision (squint and orthoptics)
- Diabetic retinopathy
- Cancer, BCC and malignant growths

- Acute glaucoma
- Chemical injuries
- CRAO
- Hyphaema
- Hypopyon
- IOP 45+
- Orbital cellulitis
- Papilloedema
- Penetrating injuries
- Retinal detachment unless this is longstanding and asymptomatic
- Sight threatening keratitis
- Sudden severe ocular pain
- Suspected temporal arteritis
- Symptomatic retinal breaks and tears
- III / IV / VI nerve palsy
- Unexplained pre-retinal haemorrhage
- Unexplained sudden loss of vision
- Uveitis
- Vitreous detachment symptoms with pigment in the vitreous
- Ischaemic optic neuropathy
- Post RTA or head trauma

- Acute dacroadenitis
- Acute dacrocystitis
- CMV and candida retinitis
- Commotio retinae
- CRVO with elevated IOP
- IOP > 35 mm hg (and < 45 mmhg)
- Melanoma
- Retinal detachment if not an emergency, see above
- Retrobulbar/optic neuritis
- Rubeosis
- Scleritis
- Squamous cell carcinoma
- Sudden onset diplopia
